Student Support Services

The Student Support Services Program provides opportunities for academic development, assists students with basic college requirements, and serves to motivate students toward the successful completion of their postsecondary education. Student Support Services (SSS) also provides limited scholarships to current SSS participants who are receiving Federal Pell Grants. The goal of SSS is to increase the college retention, transfer, and graduation rates of its participants and help students make the transition from one level of higher education to the next. To qualify for services, students must be a U.S. citizen, first generation (neither parent graduated from a four-year college), of limited income, or have a documented disability in the NWSCC ADA office. Specific services include but are not limited to tutoring, career planning and interest inventories, assistance with transfer and campus visits, academic advising and priority registration for continuing participants, financial aid planning and scholarship searches, and consideration for direct financial assistance.
